If you know someone who has Alzheimer's or Dementia, who tends to wander and may become lost, this FREE Dumont Police Department-Safely Back Home program can help. Also, if you know someone who sometimes falls and may become unconscious, this program can help. Free enrollment forms are available through the Dumont Police Department, Detective Brown.

Please bring to the Dumont Police Department (DPD): three clothing items, new or existing, which the person will enjoy wearing (shirts, blouses, sweatshirts, jackets, shorts, pants, pajamas, etc). Safely Back Home will professionally imprint the clothing for free with the person's DPD emergency contact information. If the person wanders and becomes lost, or if they experience a fall, the Dumont Police and concerned citizens will be able to assist in their rescue and return to their family.
